On Giving – from the July Penn Central Conference eNews:

Greetings friends and members of Penn Central Conference,

Luke 11:11 Is there anyone among you who, if your child asked for a fish, would give a snake instead of a fish?

I love giving gifts. Whether it's someone's favorite baked good, the book they've been dying to read, a one-of-kind handcrafted item or something really practical that will make life easier – when I see something and go "oooh she's gonna love that!" it fills me with joy. And getting to use my extensive collection of wrapping paper and ribbons to wrap it perfectly is a nice bonus.

In the second letter to the Corinthians, it says that God loves a cheerful giver. Cheerfully is my favorite way to give. But sometimes, giving comes out of obligation. Sometimes I give of my time to clean the church or make my husband dinner out of a mix of love and obligation. Of course I love him, but part of marriage is making dinner even when you'd rather be doing literally anything else. (But I'll make him do the dishes in exchange.)


In this week's gospel text, Jesus speaks about how God gives. He gives some examples – like asking a friend for bread at midnight. The friend may not want to get up and give you anything out of friendship but will give in to your persistence. He also compares the gifts of God to human parents would never give our children something dangerous when they ask for food.

We may feel like we've been asking God repeatedly for something and it never comes. More than once in the Gospels, Jesus implies that God responds to persistence. I like to think part of that is because we humans have short attention spans and that "thing" that we desperately want today is long forgotten by tomorrow. But I also believe just as God loves a cheerful giver, God IS a cheerful giver. In all divine wisdom, God knows the right exact minute that a particular gift, wrapped with a cosmic bow, needs to appear in your life. And the face of the divine lights up with joy at seeing you unwrap it.

First Aid at Trinity

Did you know there are three First Aid kits at Trinity? Do you know where they are located? Did you know there is also an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) at Trinity?

When we gather at church for services or fellowship most of us aren't concerned with where the nearest First Aid kit or AED is, but when someone has a medical event and needs help, seconds count and that is not the time to go in search of a First Aid kit or an AED.

We have two First Aid kits on the main floor of the church. One is in the kitchen on the wall by the large commercial dishwasher. The second one is on the main floor in the Narthex near the small bathroom between the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall. This same location is where the AED is located in its own cabinet just below the First Aid kit. Our third First Aid kit is located at the entrance to the Choir Room in the basement of the church.

All three First Aid kits are mounted to the wall in such a way that they can be taken to the location of the injured person. The AED is accessed by opening the door of the cabinet and taking the unit out and to where the person in need is.

Trinity is fortunate to have a number of individuals who have taken training and are certified to administer CPR and use our AED if needed. The names of these individuals are posted on lists on the Narthex bulletin board and on the bulletin board outside of the Church Office.

While medical emergencies don't happen very often at Trinity, knowing where life saving equipment is located when needed can make all the difference.

Baptism and New Members




