Take Me to the River

God often works in unexpected ways. Just ask Naaman, the army commander in 2 Kings 5:1-14. Stricken with leprosy, he traveled to Israel seeking healing from the prophet Elisha. Instead of an impressive display or a grand ceremony, Elisha sent word for him to simply wash seven times in the Jordan River.

Naaman was not impressed. "Aren't the rivers of Damascus better than all the waters of Israel?" he asked. Why bathe in a foreign, muddy river when the clean, sparkling rivers of home were far more appealing? It didn't make sense. Yet what seemed absurd became the very path to his healing.

We may not be told to wade into an actual river, but we all face "Jordan moments" in life — times when God calls us to take a step that feels uncomfortable, humbling or completely illogical. It is in those moments that trust and obedience matter most.

Naaman's story reminds us that God's power is not limited by appearances or human reasoning. Sometimes the action that feels least likely to work is the one that opens the door to blessing. When God invites you to take the plunge, step into the water. You may find healing and hope waiting there.

Suppose one of you has a servant plowing or looking after the sheep. Will he say to the servant when he comes in from the field, 'Come along now and sit down to eat'? Won't he rather say, 'Prepare my supper, get yourself ready and wait on me while I eat and drink; after that you may eat and drink'? Will he thank the servant because he did what he was told to do? So you also, when you have done everything you were told to do, should say, 'We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty." (Luke 17:7-10 NIV)

"Be careful not to practice your righteousness in front of others to be seen by them. If you do, you will have no reward from your Father in heaven. So when you give to the needy, do not announce it with trumpets, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and on the streets, to be honored by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your giving may be in secret. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.


We began the year with a "Call to Giving". This giving has taken the part of generous giving of ourselves to others and to God in the work of Christ's mission among us. This is a primary calling of Jesus to all who will follow him. He spoke frequently about giving: love, compassion and mercy, as well as food, clothing, and time to those in need around us. This month we look to quotes from Jesus to his disciples that center on the idea that we should be giving without the prospect of reward or praise from others. In the Luke text above, Jesus makes plain to us that when we give of ourselves through service to others we are simply doing our duty as he has instructed. In Matthew's gospel, he calls us to give so freely that one hand doesn't know what the other is doing. This doesn't mean to be irresponsible with our resources or time, but that our giving would be so commonplace that we do it instinctually as our duty. Jesus goes further to instruct his followers to give in secret so as to avoid praise and reward of others so that we can instead be rewarded by God. Truly Jesus understands the human condition that we like to be recognized for doing good works and serving others, but he wants his disciples to serve instinctively and not be serving for our own purpose of being praised by others. I believe Jesus calls us to give to others as part of our service to God, who will ultimately reward us.

May we go into this Season of Thanksgiving with grateful hearts recognizing what God has done for us in Christ, and how Christ calls his followers to respond in kind with generous and humble hearts.

Called to Care Committee




